





Commodities at a 13-Year Low





China's Long, Soft Fall



Oil & Commodities Halt Nigeria's Growth




Foreign Debt Soars in Africa





UN Regional Population Projections (Billions, 2015 - 2100)




Africa's Population Rising Fastest











African Cities of Opportunity









The Youngest Populations in the World by 2050



Youth Labour Force Participation Remains Low




Africa's Youth Sees Little Employment Growth





Half of World's Kids Out of School in Africa




